

BlueCat Networks helps companies identify and assess network threats while enabling critical digital transformation initiatives, like cloud computing and network virtualization. Due to rapid growth, they relocated their Toronto office to better enable collaboration, celebrate culture, and recruit and retain top talent.

For the engineering department, a "lab" workspace design provides teams of 8–10 with universal workstation sizes and shared scrum walls, huddle spaces, and meeting and phone rooms. These flexible team zones utilize the same desk module and can be arranged in multiple configurations to best support each team, further encouraging growth and innovation. Enclosed rooms can be offices or meeting rooms, depending on need, in addition to the three large, private offices designed specifically for the executives. Corporate departments, including operations, HR, IT, etc., utilize the same desk module in their zones, but without scrum walls.

A servery adjacent to the reception holds catered meals for staff. They eat, play, and collaborate in a multi-purpose space with a café, beer tap, video games, picnic-style tables, and garage doors that expand the training rooms into town hall meeting space. A "walk in the park" design theme is implemented with expansive views, daylight, natural materials, tree room names, and leaf graphics.
